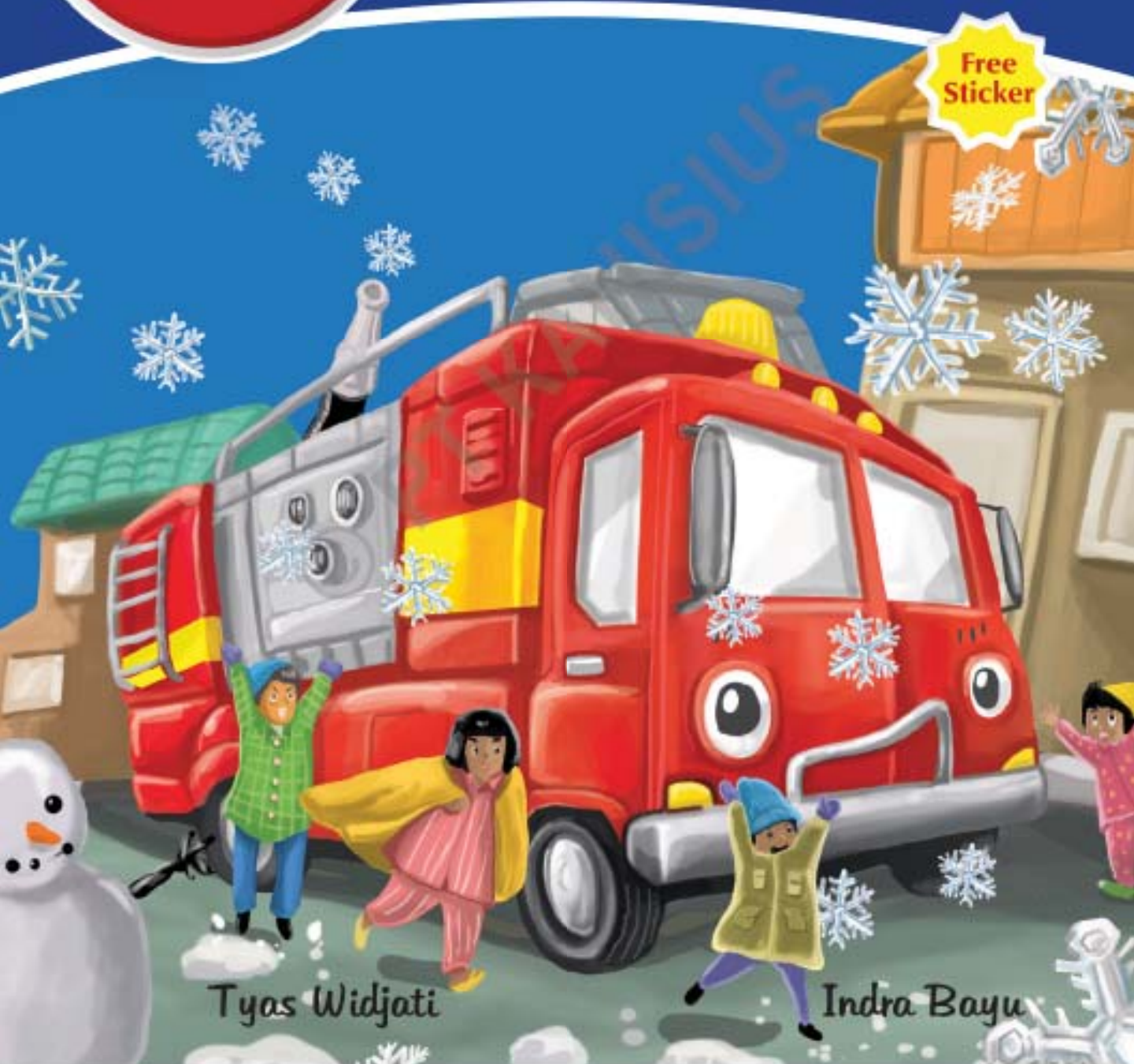



Elin, the quick and agile equipment truck.



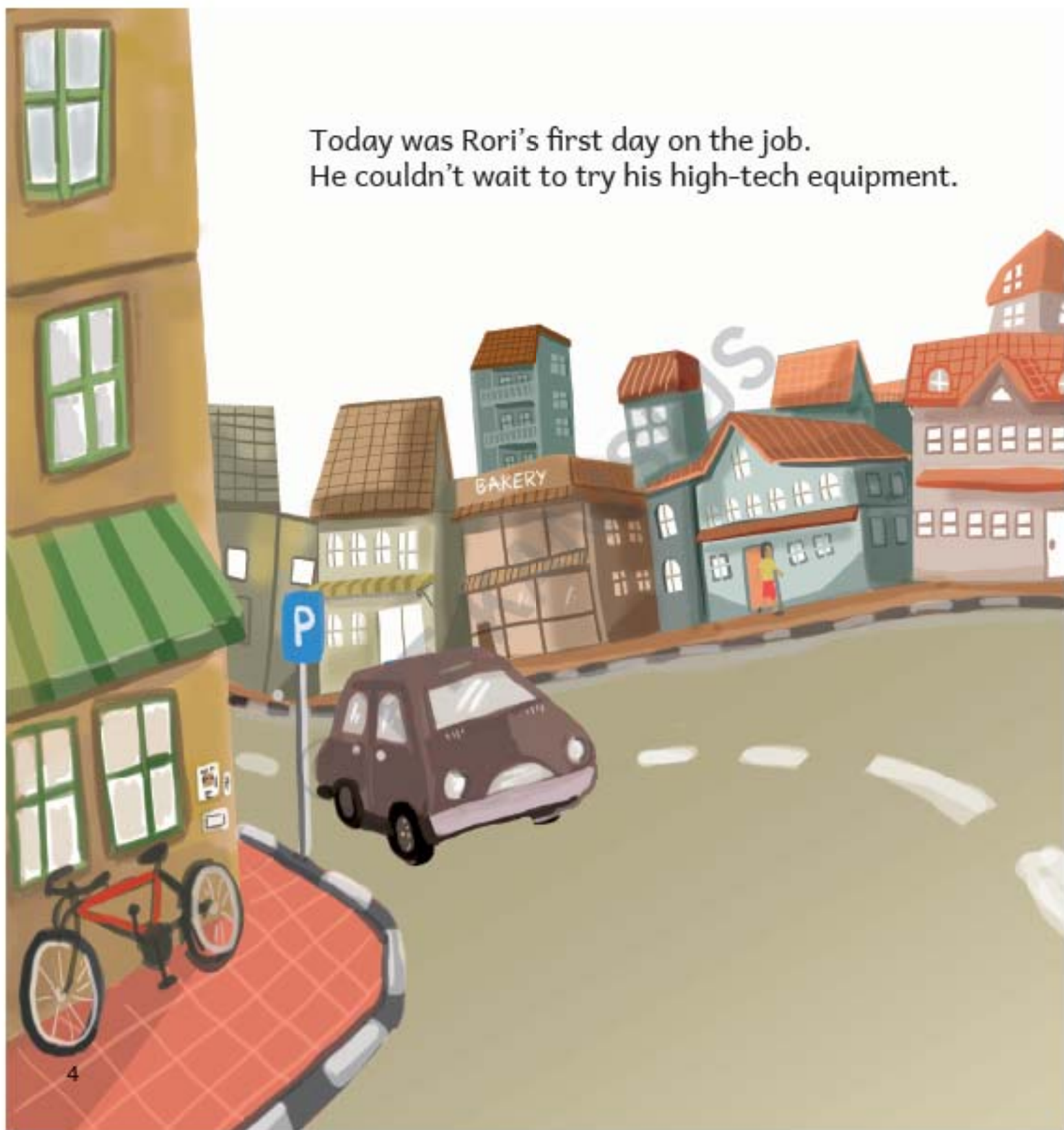
Hugo, the most equipped truck and a very firm captain of the team.

His new team was already waiting for him at the Fire Station.

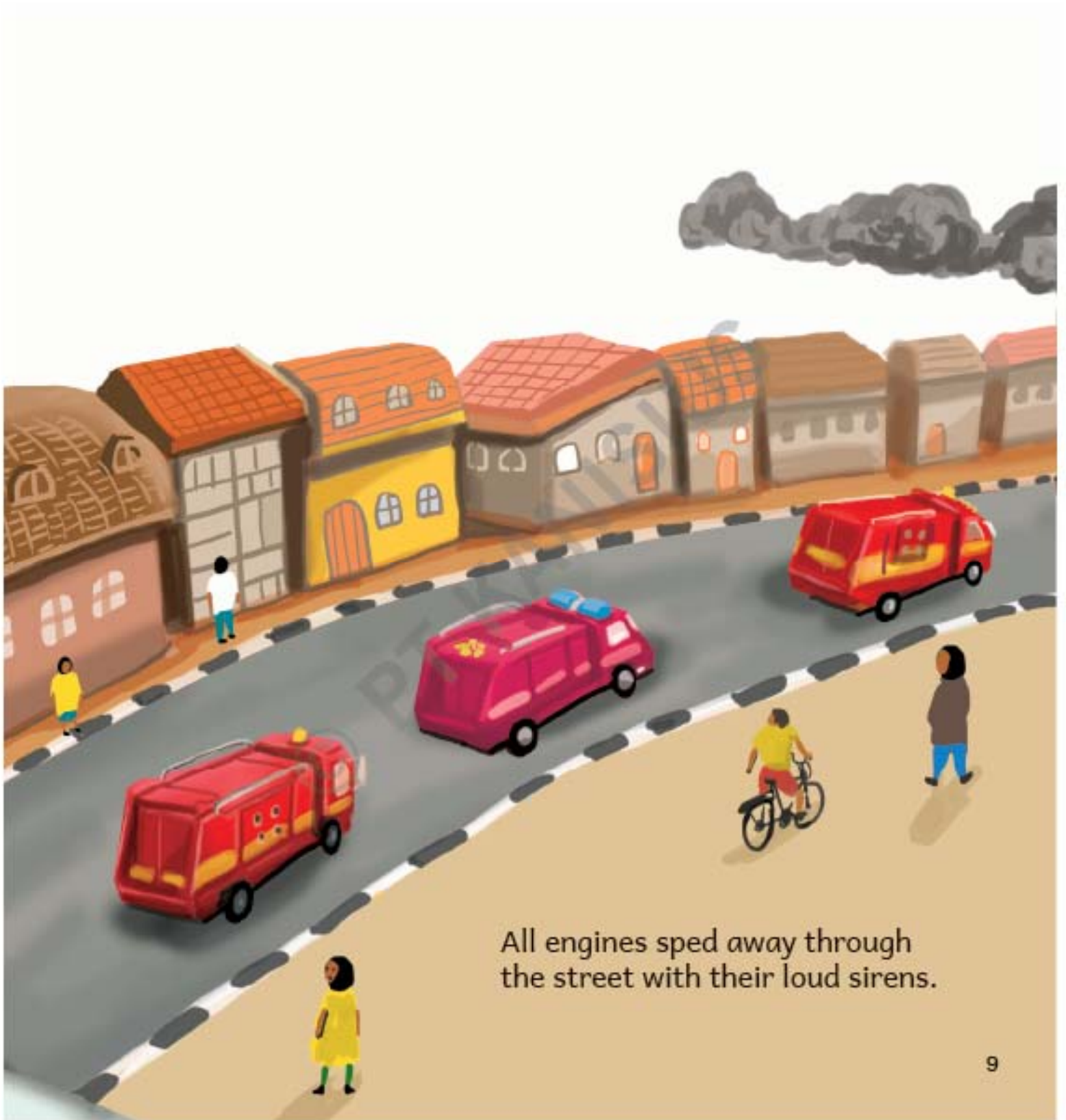


“Welcome to Nui Town, Rori,” greeted Hugo.
“We need an excellent water tender ruck.”



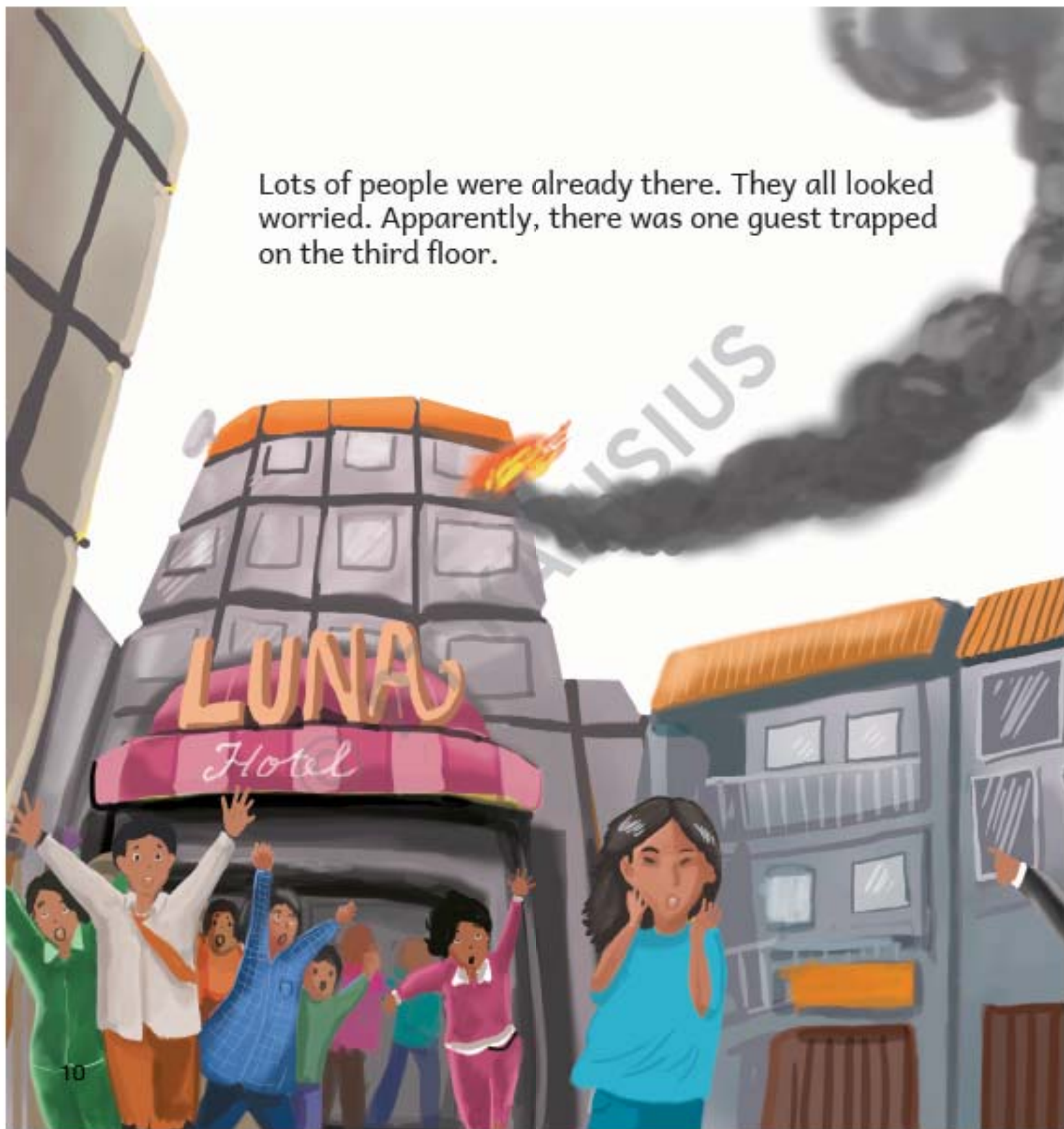
Before Rori could reply Hugo, suddenly the fire alarm went off. “Emergency call to Luna Hotel, team!” shouted Hugo.



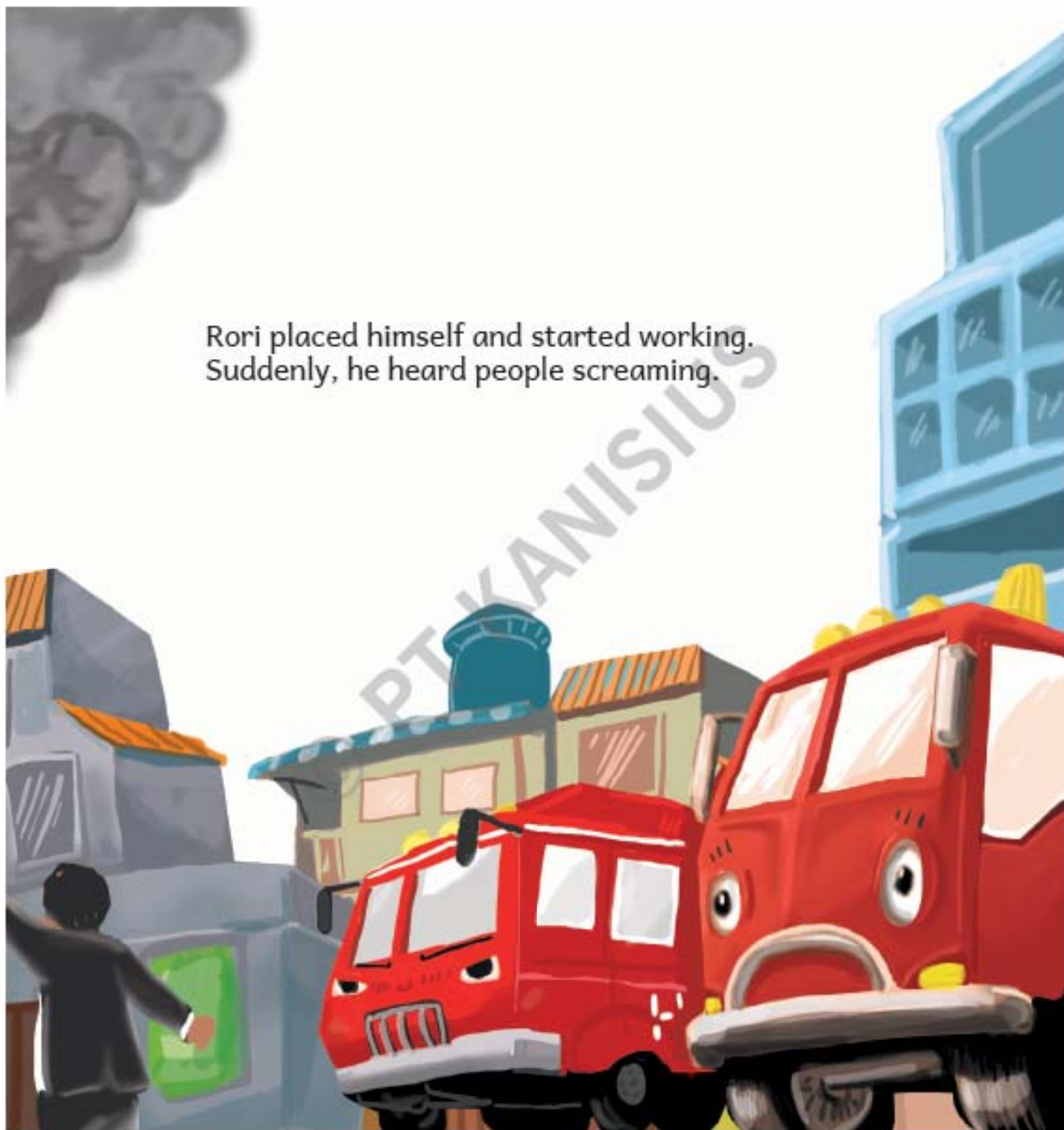


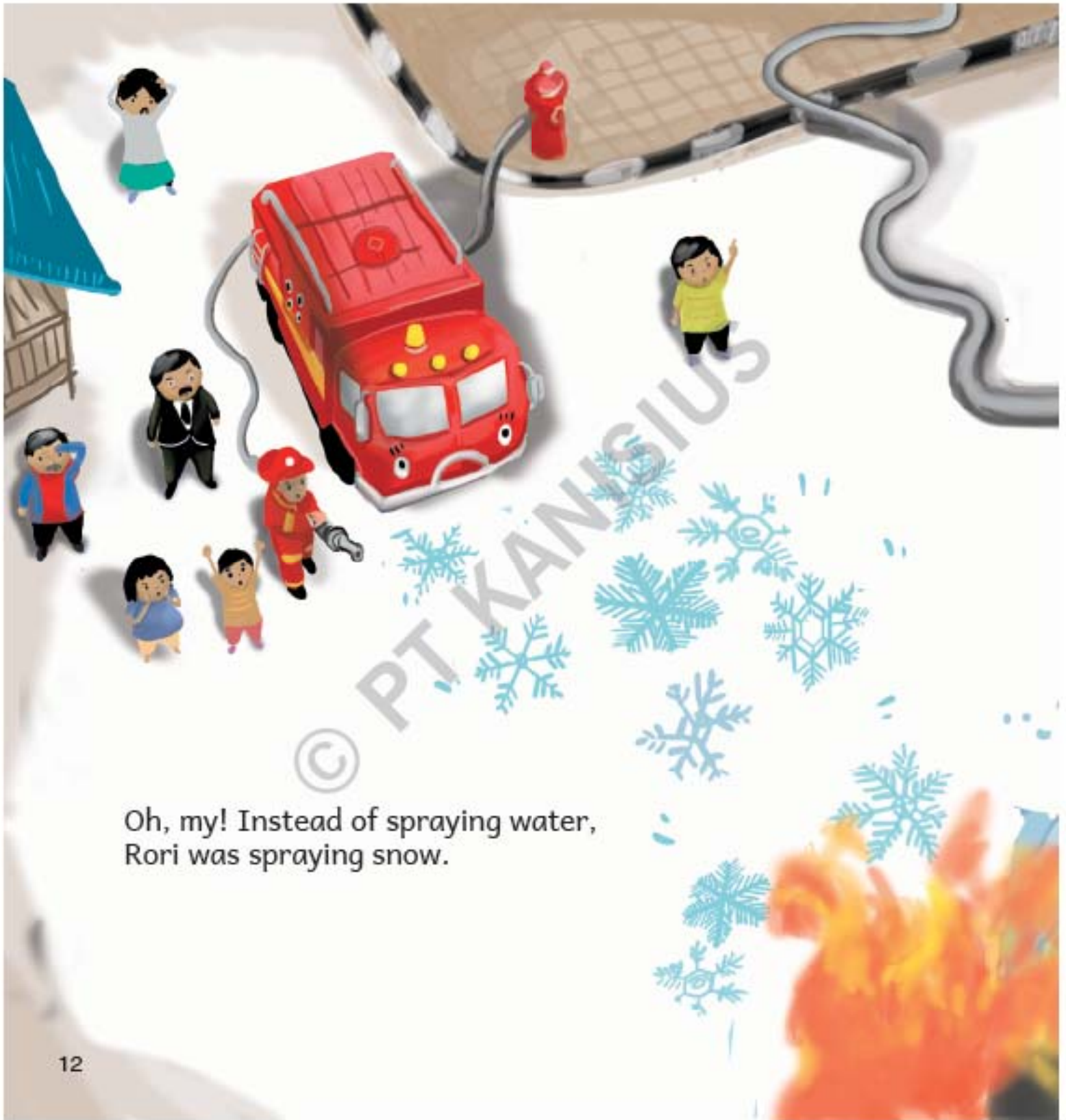
All engines sped away through the street with their loud sirens.

Suddenly, he heard people screaming.





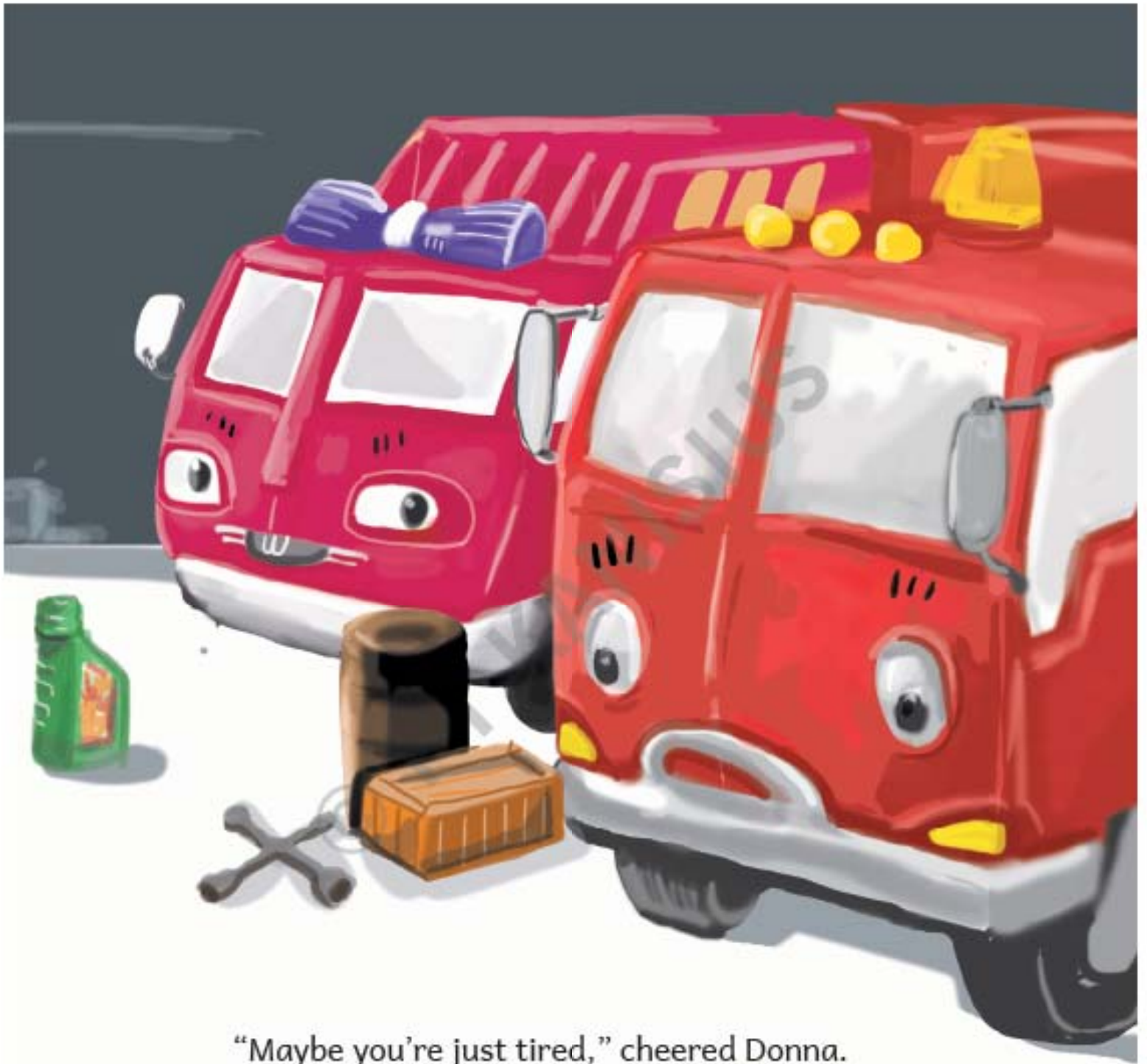
Oh, my! Instead of spraying water,

“Why don’t you take some rest?”

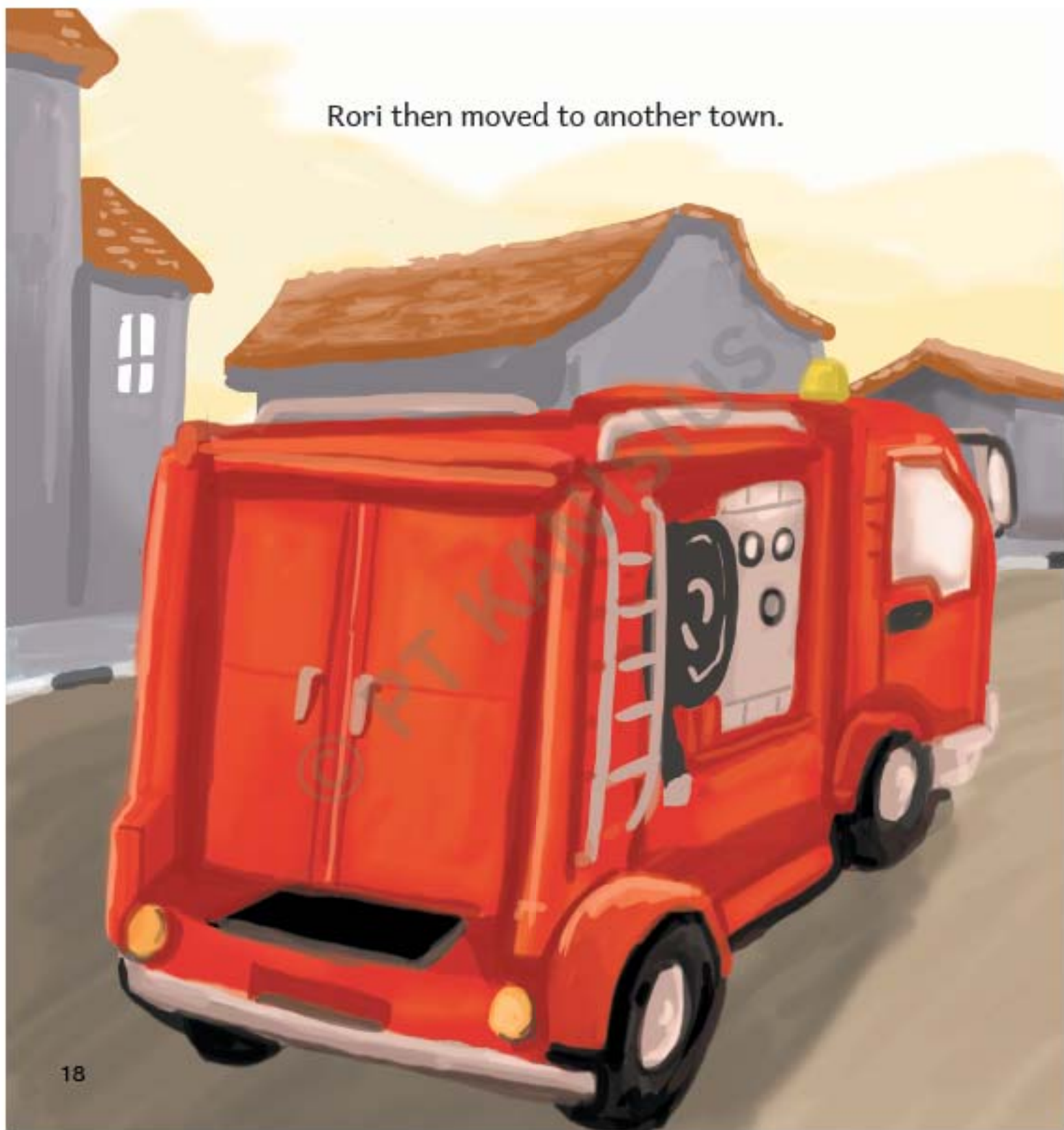
Since snow couldn't put the fire out quick enough, Rori was assigned to do simpler tasks.



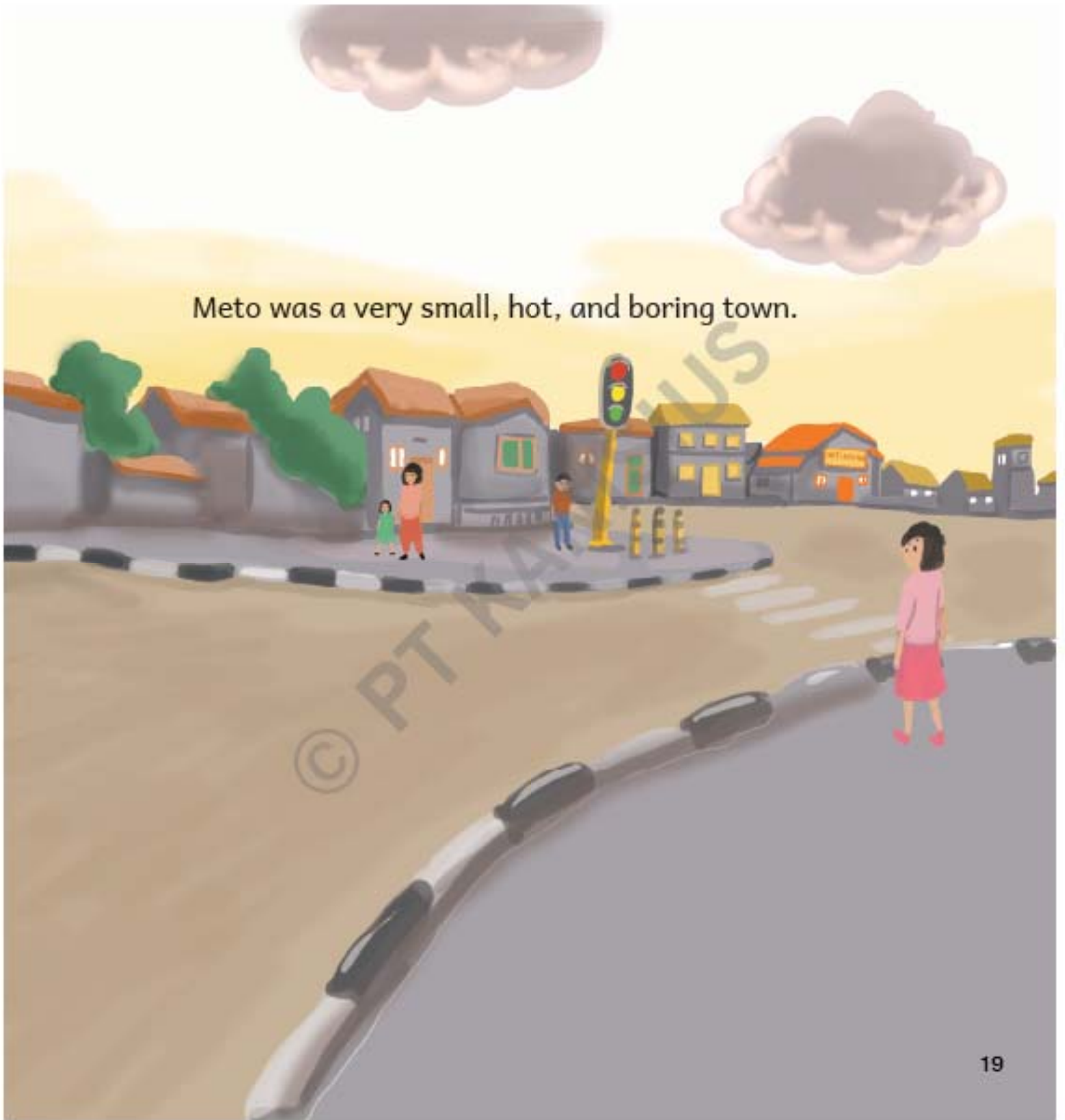

“There hasn’t been any fire so far.”






Rori kept on trying to perfect himself.






He really wanted to save someone from a fire.

sighed Rori.






One night, the alarm went off.

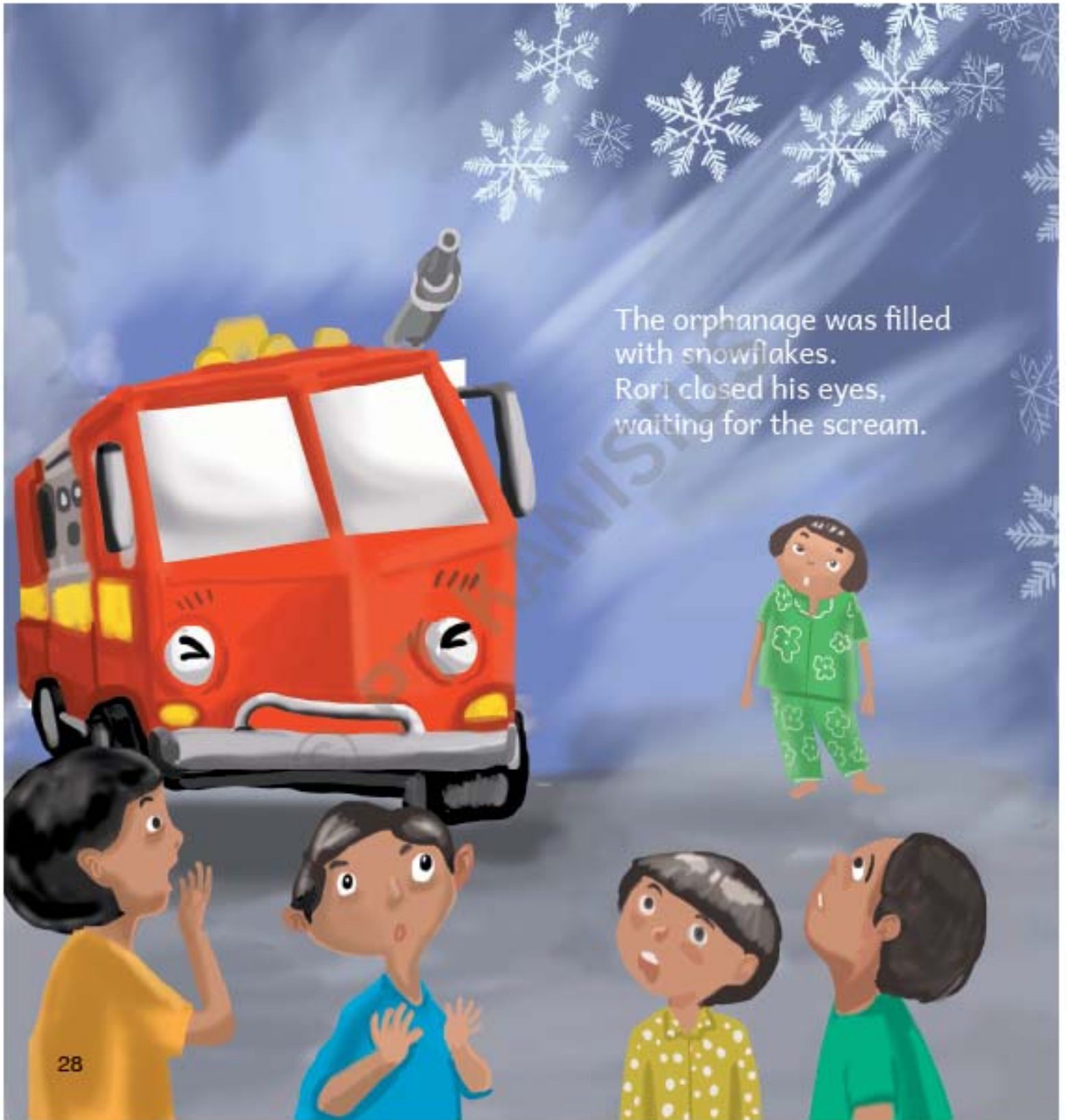
The call came from

wondered Rori.



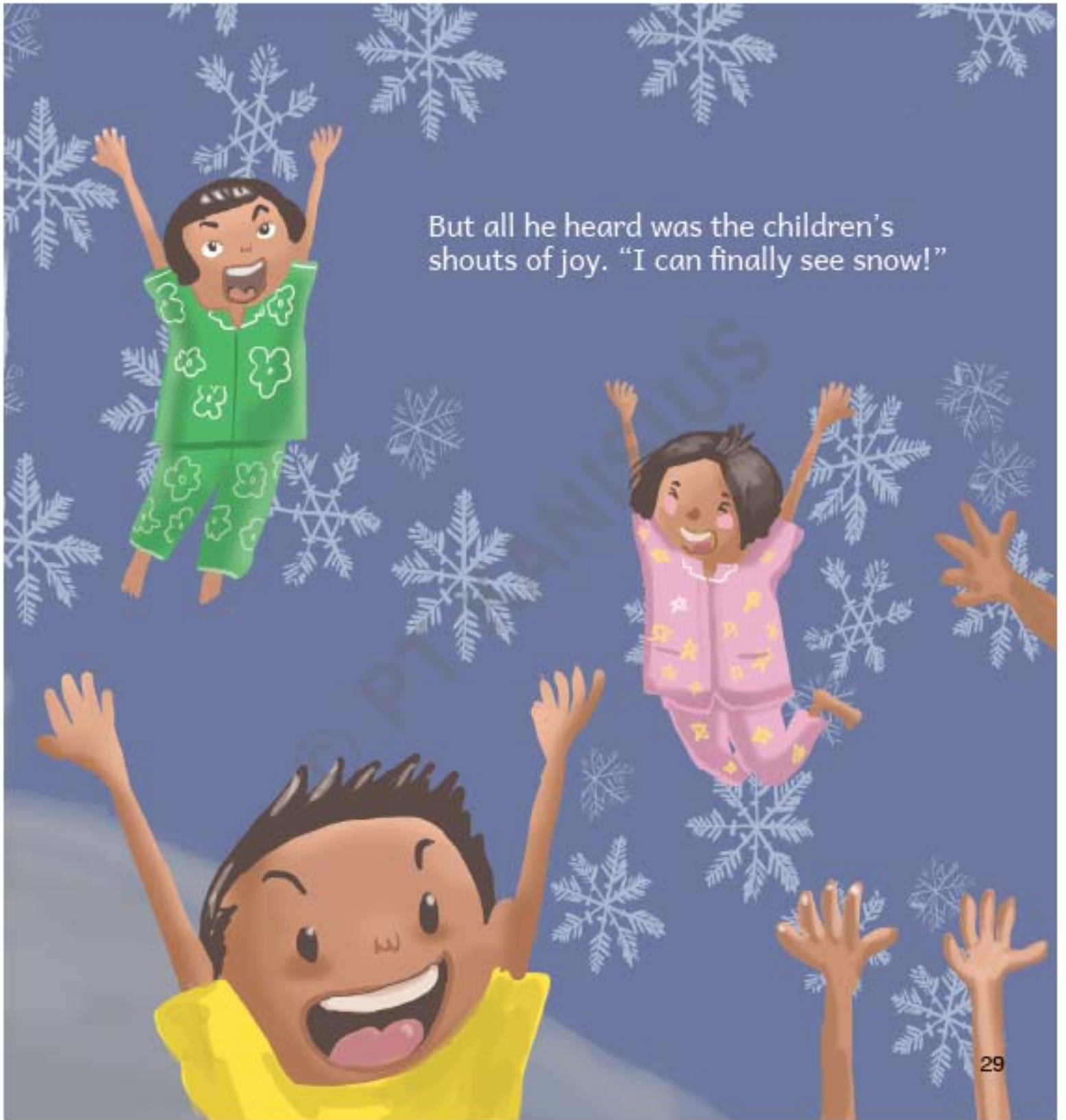

"Oh, no!" shouted Rori.





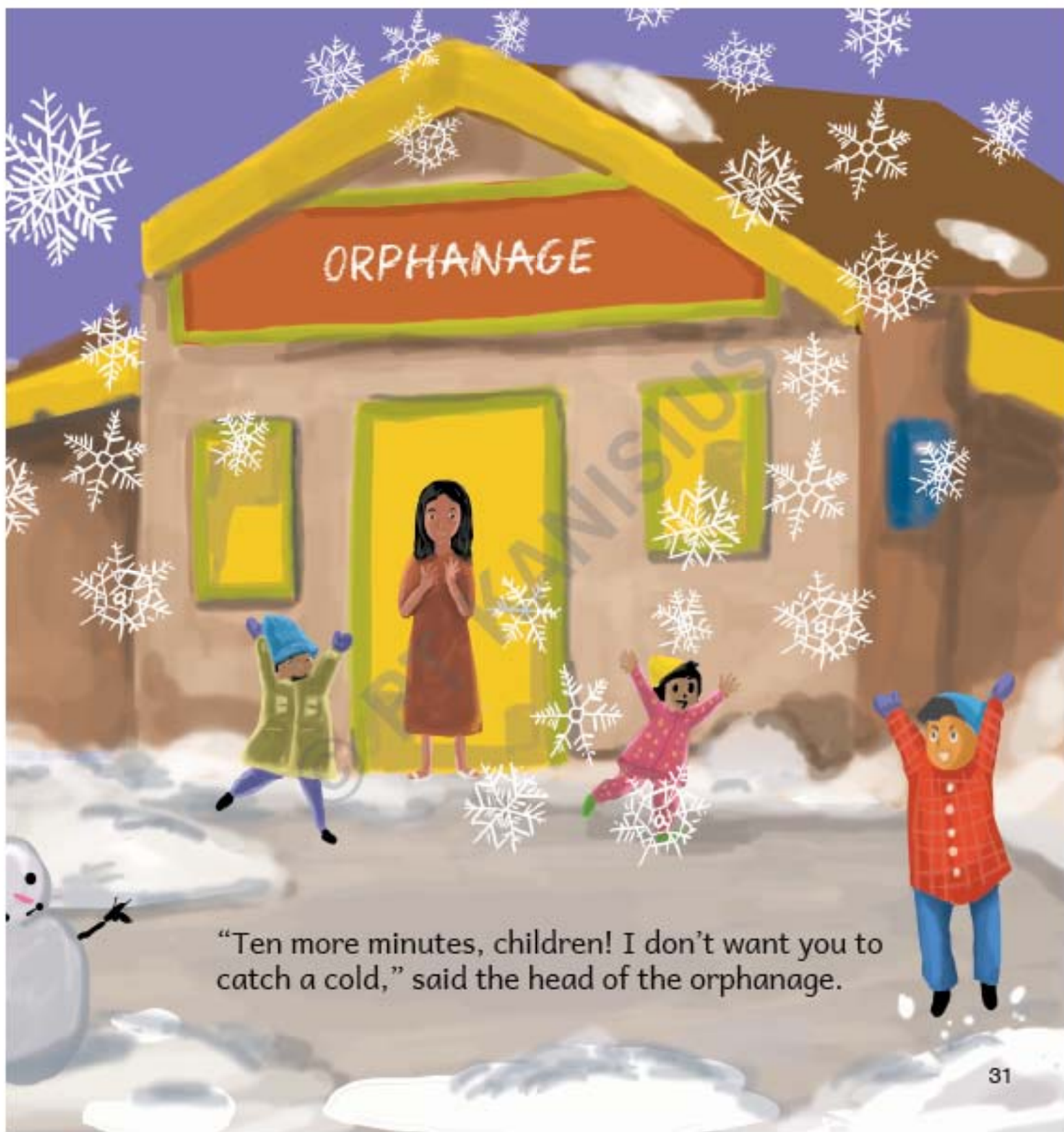
The orphanage was filled with snowflakes. Rori closed his eyes, waiting for the scream.



But all he heard was the children's shouts of joy. "I can finally see snow!"

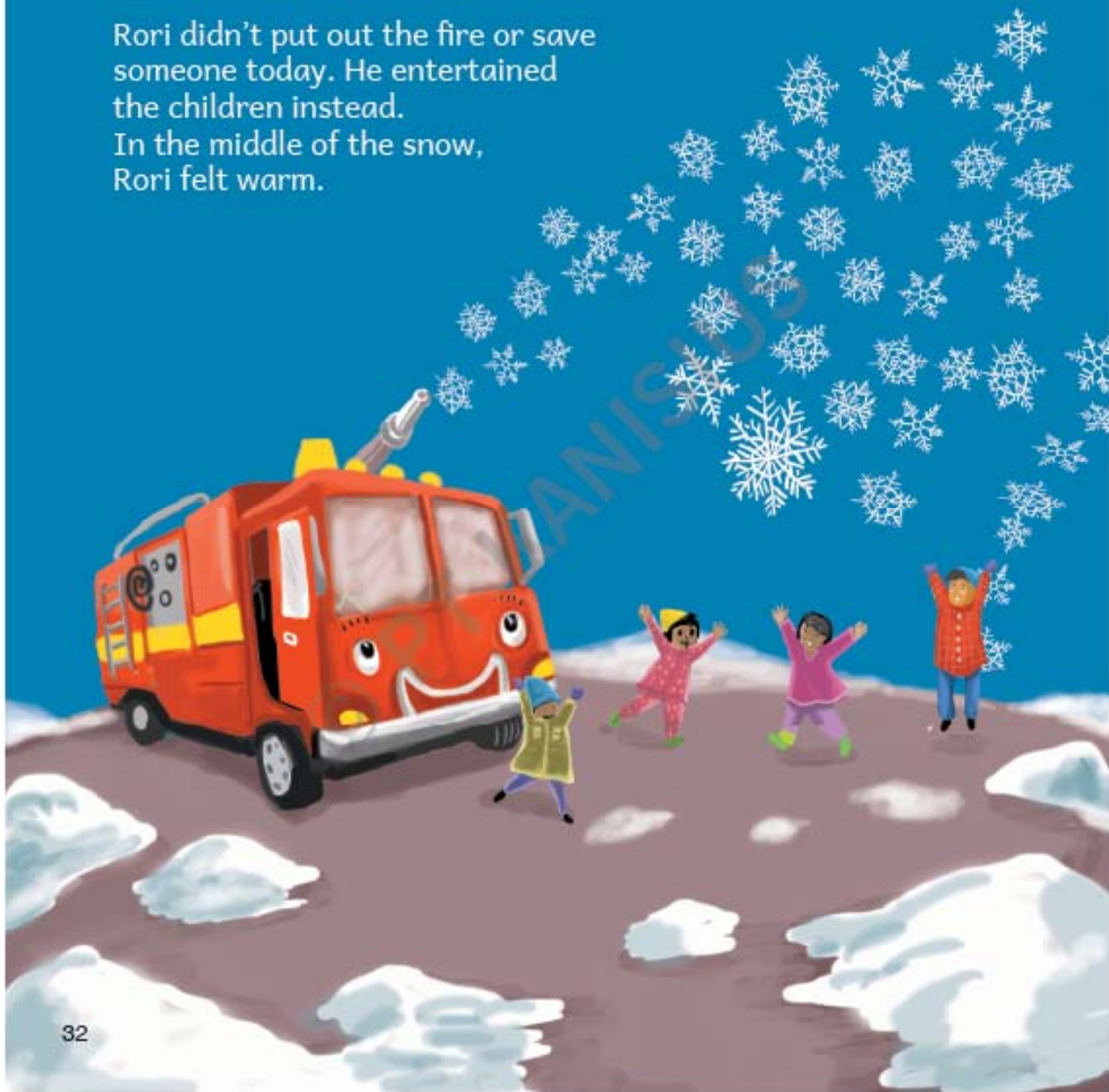
That night, Rori stayed a little bit longer.
